7 Churches - Ephesus

Introduction: Asia Minor; <u>Greek</u> language; Fall of <u>Jerusalem</u>; Judaism; <u>Hellenism</u>; Temple cults; Acts <u>19</u>; "knowledge"

The Church at Ephesus – Revelation 2:1-7

Ephesus – Geography; religions; "Letters"; politics; Panamanian Games; Aquila & Priscilla

Revelation 2:1-3, 6 - Nothing is <u>hid</u> from God's eyes, he is omniscient and knows everything. <u>Acts</u> <u>20:29-31</u>; Matthew 7:15

Nicolaitans - They were <u>antinomian</u> in nature and wanted less <u>rules</u> and relaxing of the ones that existed. They were followers of <u>Balaam</u> (Numbers 25)

What I Learn: Patient endurance (2:2,3) - Part of walking by <u>faith</u> is patiently waiting upon God as he works out his <u>will</u> in the local Church.

This church "could not bear with those who are evil" (2:2).

People are not driven off or cast out, they are <u>confronted</u>, patiently, they are born with and the leaders are not put off by their presence; they work with them while <u>protecting</u> the flock. God sees his own and loves them wherever they are in their spiritual <u>journey</u>.

Revelation 2:4-5 - There is something that Christ sees, "you have <u>abandoned</u> the love you had at first" (2:4).

Precept: If we don't stand <u>accountable</u> to the Word of God offered by the servants of God in this life we will most certainly be accountable before God at the end of the <u>age</u>.

Revelation 2:7 - First, "He who has ears"; Second, "To the one who conquers"

What I Learn: "What should be the first love of any <u>one</u> Church?" and "Does God have a first love that should be part of <u>all</u> Churches?

Conclusion: This letter gives insight into true Christian maturity.

New Testament <u>love</u> is a defining element of the local Church and should never take a back seat. Church <u>leadership</u> is responsible for this proper Biblical balance in Church life.

The promises at the end of each letter wrap together the <u>victor's crown</u>. We must see that <u>the</u> <u>results</u> of living for Christ are not our responsibility, <u>living</u> for Christ is, and that is what is at stake in this warning.

The local Church has three primary activities; <u>first</u>, a clear proclamation of the <u>Gospel</u>; <u>second</u>, consistent practice of the <u>ordinances</u>, and <u>third</u>, the faithful administration of New Testament Church <u>discipline</u>. The gospel is not complete without the <u>love of God</u> leading!
