

## Come & Worship

Luke 1:67-80

The Bible outlines history in three acts:

Act One is recorded in Genesis 1-3.

Act Two God sets the stage for the arrival of his Son, Jesus Christ, the light of the world (John 8:12).

Act Three begins with the return of Jesus Christ - Revelation

In each act we are called to come and worship.

Worship scenes in the second act:

Scene #1 - Mary - Luke 1:26-33; 46-55

Scene #2 - Shepherds - Luke 2:1-8

Scene #3 - Aged Saints - Luke 2:25-38

Scene #4 - Wise Men - Matthew 2:1-12

Scene #5 - Samaritan Woman - John 4:21-52

Come and worship Jesus, the King of Kings, Lord of Lords, the creator God who became man to bring us back to himself (1 Peter 3:18).

### ***Worshippers***

Matthew 2:1-12 - The magi were given to worship but they did not really know the one they came to worship; it was duty-centered.

Luke 2:21-38 - These two saints point to a life of humility and generosity but they also represent Israel and God's frustration with them.

Luke 2:1-20 - The shepherds received a direct call from God through the angels to come and worship the "Savior, who is Christ the Lord". How we respond will affect our eternity.
