## "The Wrath of God" Revelation 16

## Introduction & Review:

Revelation 16 – In rapid fire we read about the end of God's wrath on sin and sinful mankind. It is apparent that there is similarity between these final plagues and what God did in <u>Egypt</u> (Exodus 4-14).

1. "Painful <u>sores</u>" - Revelation 16:2 - Exodus 9:9-10; Job 2:7; Luke 16:21

2. "Seas turned to blood" - Revelation 16:3 - This is a judgment that reflects the <u>local</u> judgment of Egypt in Exodus 7:7-21.

3. "Rivers & springs turned to blood" - Revelation 16:4 - People are left to find <u>clean</u> water sources. And this mirrors the third trumpet judgment. What happened to the <u>Nile</u> (Exodus 7:20-24) now takes over the whole world.

4. "Sun scorches people" - Revelation 16:8-9 - This is the only plague that has no comparison in the plagues of Egypt but the picture that comes through these two verses is "actual <u>tongues of fire</u> burning people". (Osbourne, 586)

5. "Beast's kingdom <u>Darkened</u>" - Revelation 16:10-11 - This mirrors the plague that engulfed Egypt. (Exodus 10:21-29; Joel 2:2; 3:14-15 ; Mark 13:24; Luke 21:25)

6. "Euphrates dried up" - Revelation 16:12 - This sixth bowl mirrors the sixth <u>trumpet</u>. (Revelation 9:13-19)

7. "A Loud voice, Greatest <u>Earthquake</u>, Massive Hail" - Revelation 16:17-21 - We should see this as the most devastating <u>environmental</u> disaster of history. The surface of the earth and everything on it will be <u>altered</u> or <u>destroyed</u> (18-19).

**Conclusion**: Being alive during the days described as the final seven plagues of God's wrath will be unparalleled in history. <u>Commerce</u> will end, <u>geography</u> will be transformed and <u>fear</u> will rule, not fear of any man but fear of the unknown and of <u>God</u> who controls the unknown.

The 'mark of the beast' and the 'battle of Armageddon' are passing buzz words that have turned into <u>cult like</u> obsessions. We should see the 'mark of the beast' as an indicator of those who are against <u>Christ</u> and 'Armageddon' as the defeat of <u>Satan</u> and his human forces in <u>space</u> and <u>time</u>.

There seems to be a real shift in these seven plagues from the former seals and trumpets; the possibility of <u>repentance</u> has faded dramatically. These bowl judgments reflect that direct accountability that God took with <u>Pharaoh</u> and leads to a divine plan to free God's people of Satan's stranglehold on <u>culture</u> and cultural <u>influences</u>.

An important idea comes full circle in these plagues; "Evil participates in its <u>own</u> destruction." (Osbourne, 601) (Romans 8:19-21) This coming reality should remind us that <u>deception</u> will rule the end times and <u>discernment</u> is vital for a blessed life.
