Rainbows & Family Connections

Genesis 8:20-10:32

Introduction: These verses have three parts: Fruitful and <u>Multiplying</u>, Noahic Covenant, Blessings & Curses from Ancestors

<u>Fruitful and Multiplying</u> - Genesis 1:22, 28; Genesis 8:17; Genesis 9:1, 7 contain the statement, "be fruitful and multiply"; the first was to <u>Adam and Eve</u>, the second to Noah as he exited the <u>ark</u> and the third is found in our text.

Summary: The command to "be fruitful and multiply" in this text speaks of <u>physical</u> children but when Jesus co-opted this statement and gave us the great commission (Matthew 28:19-20) he was saying we should be fruitful and multiply <u>spiritually</u>.

Noahic Covenant - Genesis 6:18; 8:21b-22; 9:8-17 - This kind of covenant was called a "Royal Grant Covenant" in the ancient world.

Summary: The Noahic Covenant reminds us that God always keeps his <u>promises</u> and the <u>sinfulness</u> of man and mankind will never change that. God will redeem mankind by a means that does not result in the <u>death</u> of nearly everyone, rather by the death of <u>someone</u> who has the power to redeem many by his shed blood.

<u>Blessings & Curses from Ancestors</u> – Genesis 9:18-10:32 – We should see this section as a <u>prophecy</u> of what generally takes place with Noah's three <u>sons</u>. Shem leads to the family of <u>Abraham</u>; Ham points to the <u>Canaanites</u> who populated the eastern shores of the Mediterranean Sea and Japheth points to the <u>Indo-European</u> lines that enjoyed the blessings of Shem's tent.

Summary: My ancestors matter; but my <u>choices</u> matter more! (2 Samuel 24:10; Psalm 32:5; 51:2-5).

Conclusion: Japheth - Genesis 10:2-5; Ham - Genesis 10:6-20 and Shem - Genesis 10:21-31 should remind us of <u>Psalm 16:5-6</u>. An adult is someone who takes full <u>responsibility</u> for their choices. Choices matter more than family <u>iniquities</u>.

The fruitfulness that is enjoined in these verses is primarily speaking of <u>physical</u> progeny but the New Testament challenges God's people to be involved in <u>spiritual</u> children and <u>grandchildren</u>, sons and daughters who walk in the works and ways of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Genesis 6-9 is referenced in <u>Hebrews 11:7</u> - Part of the definition of 'faith' in Hebrews 11:1 is "the conviction of things not seen". Noah believed God and that belief took the form of <u>obedience</u> that resulted in construction of the ark. This belief and obedience is at the heart of "becoming an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith" (7b). Faith is <u>believing</u> and <u>acting</u> on that belief is a matter of life and death.
