"Helping God"

Genesis 16

Introduction: The story of Abram has roots in Judaism, Christianity and Islam. <u>Judaism</u> stops with the story of Isaac and is waiting; <u>Islam</u> follows the story of Ishmael and celebrates the arrival of the prophet Mohammed; but <u>Christianity</u> follows the story of Isaac that leads to <u>Jesus Christ</u> rooted in the <u>promise</u> of <u>Genesis 12</u> and this story.

<u>Abram's household</u> - Genesis 16:1-6 - What Sarai did was <u>normal and expected</u>; the family line had to be kept alive and if that meant another mother, so be it.

Polygamy - Is polygamy part of God's plan for marriage?

<u>First</u>, we must recognize the difference in the Bible between <u>descriptive</u> and <u>prescriptive</u> texts.

Second, the nature of polygamy in the Old Testament is spoken of <u>negatively</u>.

<u>Third</u>, the New Testament speaks of Abraham and David's faith but not as examples for <u>marriage</u>.

Fourth, God states His design for marriage in Genesis 2:22-24; Mark 10:6-9.

<u>Fifth</u>, God's design for marriage is to display the <u>gospel</u>. In marriage, the husband represents <u>Christ</u>, and the bride is represented by the <u>church</u> (Ephesians 5:22-33).

<u>Sixth</u>, the language of the New Testament explicitly states that marriage is between <u>one man</u> and <u>one woman</u>. (Ephesians 5:22-33, 1 Timothy 3:2, 12).

<u>Finally</u>, children also need the *one husband-one wife* structure in the family for two reasons. First, God is our <u>Father</u>, and children need their earthly fathers to model godliness to them. Second, children need to see the gospel in their <u>parents'</u> marriage.

Hagar's wilderness - Genesis 16:7-12

Ishmael's birth - Genesis 16:13-16

Precept: God is fully <u>present</u> and fully <u>aware</u> of all circumstances. <u>Psalm 139:1-16</u>

Summary: When Sarai called or heard Ishmael's name, she would have been reminded and again prompted to "call on God who hears", something she did not do in our story.

Conclusion: God is a God who <u>sees</u>, <u>hears</u> and <u>understands</u> the situations we find ourselves in; God also has the <u>power</u> to bring his plans to fruition and all he asks us to do is to be <u>patient</u>, wait upon him and rest in his goodness. God has the power to <u>care</u> for us when we are caught in things created by others and he is ready to hear our <u>confession</u> when we are the one who caused the anguish we are in at this moment - this is our God! He is <u>omni-competent</u>, he does not need our help; but when he speaks we must <u>obey</u>, until then be <u>patient</u>.
