"Testing Faith"

Genesis 22:1-19

Introduction: One purpose of faith is to <u>rest</u> in God's power and God's promises; therefore faith must be <u>tested</u>; and God tests often.

Human Sacrifice: Leviticus 20:2-5; Ezekiel 20:25-26

Genesis 22 - Testing Faith - When God speaks Abraham is <u>already</u> listening and that reminds me that I can <u>tune</u> my heart and ears to <u>hear the Lord</u>.

Beersheba to Moriah - 1b-6 - (Abraham & Obedience)

True Worship

True worship is <u>God</u> centered and anything that takes him from that position is <u>man</u>-centered and not true worship. True worship always puts <u>God</u> in his rightful place; true worship declares the <u>worth</u> of <u>God</u> and calls us to make all other things <u>worthless</u> by comparison.

Climb up Moriah - (7-8) - (Abraham & Isaac)

God's Provision

The Hebrew that translates "God will provide" is <u>Jehovah-Jireh</u>, and is a transliteration of a Hebrew verb that simply means "<u>to see</u>". The best way to understand this is that seeing is 'foreseeing' or 'previsioning' and points to God's <u>provision</u> for all who believe by faith.

Moriah to Beersheba - (9-19a) - (God & <u>Isaac's</u> Faith)

A Father's Faith

Two things; <u>First</u>, Abraham seems to have lived out his faith <u>honestly</u> and <u>openly</u> before his family and his son had a front row seat. <u>Second</u>, as Abraham lives out his faith <u>God</u> makes the effort of revealing himself to <u>Isaac</u> such that it changes Isaac's life permanently.

Conclusion: The appearance of the ram, caught in the thicket points to a <u>substitutionary atonement</u> and directs us to the system that God established for his people Israel. <u>2 Corinthians 5:21</u> explains it simply.

Verses 15-16 - <u>Obedience</u> is always the right response to <u>God</u> and <u>prompt</u> obedience is the witness of a <u>mature</u> faith.

Romans 8:28-34 is considered by scholars as "the chief allusion to Genesis 22" (Mathews 300). <u>Isaac</u> will not do, we need a perfect sacrifice, and <u>Jesus Christ</u> is the only perfect sacrifice. (Acts 4:26-28)

At the heart of true worship is a healthy <u>fear of God</u> with love, adoration and reverence for his <u>beauty</u> and <u>power</u>.

This story anticipates the words of Samuel to King Saul in <u>1 Samuel 15:22-23</u>. <u>Obedience</u> is essential to life with God and the life of faith.
