## 'Contending for the Faith'

Jude 3-4

Jude 3-4 - The phrase "contend for the faith" has three descriptors; 'ungodly people', 'pervert the grace of God', and, 'deny our Master and Lord, Jesus Christ'.

<u>Godly lives</u> - <u>integrity</u>, <u>knowledge</u> of God and His Word, practices personal <u>purity</u> and self-control

Reminder: 2 Timothy 3:12; Philippians 1:29; 1 Peter 2:21

God's grace in our lives - Ephesians 1:3-14

Reminder: Galatians 1:6-9; 3:11b

<u>Affirming the life and work of the Lord Jesus Christ</u> - <u>New</u> Testament books, Jesus' <u>deity</u>, (<u>Nicaea</u> in 325 AD; <u>Constantinople</u> in 381 AD; <u>Chalcedon</u> - 451 AD)

1 Corinthians 15

First, the gospel depends on it - 1 Corinthians 15:1-4

Second, witnesses testified to the resurrection - 1 Corinthians 15:5-8

Third, our sin problem required a certain death - 1 Corinthians 15:12-20a

But we know that Jesus rose from the dead! (20a)

<u>Fourth</u>, the resurrection resolved our <u>death problem</u> - 1 Corinthians 15:20b-50 - (Job 19:26; Ezekiel 37:1-4; Daniel 12:2; John 6:44; Acts 4:1-2; Ephesians 2:6-7; 1 Thessalonians 4:16; Romans 6:3-5

**Concept:** It was the resurrection that initiated the joy of being in Christ. Without the resurrection, life is meaningless; but with the resurrection anything in life that is hard can be <u>endured</u>.

**Reminder**: The <u>Covenant of Redemption</u> demands a full re-creation of all things in order that what the Father and Holy Spirit promised the <u>Son</u>, is fulfilled. The Son completed the work that the Father gave him and the Father and the Holy Spirit <u>will</u> complete the gift by seeing to it that all that was tainted by sin is <u>renewed</u> and that includes the <u>resurrection</u> of all who have died in Christ.

Conclusion: I contend for some kind of faith; but is it the faith that is revealed in <u>Scripture</u>? If it's the faith revealed in scripture then it's <u>Godly</u> by Biblical standards; its all about <u>grace</u> by Scriptural standards and it fully embraces and proclaims the Bible's statements and revelations about Jesus Christ. That contending always includes a firm belief in the <u>resurrection of our Lord</u> and a firm faith that one day, <u>I too</u>, by God's grace, will likewise, rise from the dead to live with him for eternity.
