## Jacob meets the Lord

Genesis 28

Genesis 28 - Jacob and Isaac

Jacob's <u>blessing</u> - Genesis 28:1-5 and Jacob's <u>dream</u> - Genesis 28:10-22.

Contingent decisions - Genesis 28:6-9

**Precept**: Joshua 24:15 - For a Christian there have to be decisions that are <u>always</u> aligned with what God desires no matter what others are doing; who we <u>worship</u>, who we <u>marry</u> and what we choose as our <u>work</u>.

**Summary**: God's will is done; even though it was done in a way that was not God's way; it was nevertheless done. The culprit in all of this may be <u>Rebekah</u>.

<u>Jacob's blessing</u> – Genesis 28:1-5

**Precept**: God so empowered the Patriarchs that their <u>words</u> took on life; they <u>prophesied</u> what was coming.

**Summary**: Jacob was blessed twice by his <u>father</u>; but, <u>God</u> chose him and <u>Paul</u> reminds us of this in <u>Romans 9:7-13</u>.

Jacob's dream – Genesis 28:10-22

**Concept**: God moments are real and they happen to each of us. It is important to realize that any encounter with God is <u>life altering</u> whether you are fully aware of it or not.

**Precept**: There are no gods of this world that <u>communicate</u>; the God of the Bible is the only <u>communicating</u> God (Hebrews 1:1-2).

**Summary**: <u>John 1:50-51</u>

**Conclusion**: <u>Symbols</u> can be important but we must resist making the <u>symbol</u> more important than the reality that it represents.

Our God was first the God of <u>Abraham, Isaac and Jacob</u>. Then He was the God of the tribes of Israel, and today God is the God of all who are the <u>children</u> of Abraham by <u>faith</u> and they are called by God through Jesus Christ and by the power of the Holy Spirit to go and make disciples of all nations that we all might be part of this great <u>blessing</u>.

Jacob's vow should remind us of how <u>dependent</u> we are on God.

Notice what he anticipates from God;

God's <u>presence</u>; God's <u>provision</u> and God's <u>protection</u>.
